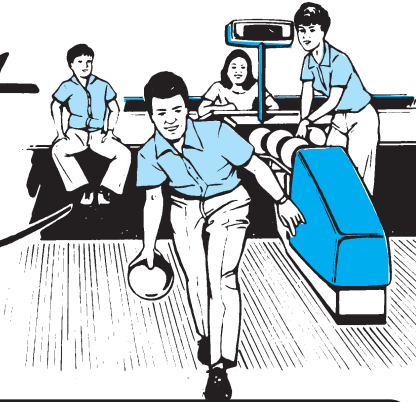

## Wichita Woman Breaks National Three-Game Record with 879 Set

ARLINGTON, Texas — Former Wichita State bowler Katie Verbil narrowly missed becoming the first woman to roll a 900 series Wednesday night at West Acres Bowl in Wichita, Kan.

The Phoenix native threw 33 consecutive strikes to start the "Battle of the Sexes" league, but a 10-pin ended the run for the left-hander. She finished with games of 300, 300 and 279 for an 879 series.

Pending formal approval, Verbil's series would be the highest in bowling history by a woman, according to United States Bowling Congress records.

"It hasn't really sunk in yet," said Verbil, whose previous best series of 845 came in July 2007. "I can't even put into words how it feels. It's so surreal. It's an amazing feeling to hold a national record like that. It was fun and it was intense. Probably the most fun

I've had in a long time."

Verbil, who competed collegiately at Wichita State from 1998 to 2002, headed into the 10th frame of the final game with a chance to shoot just the 22nd perfect series in USBC history. But she left a 10-pin on a solid pocket shot.

"That darn 10-pin," Verbil said. "I'm just glad it wasn't a 7-pin because I probably wouldn't have

spared it. I was more nervous throwing my spare ball."

The previous record for high three-game series by a woman was 878, which was set on Dec. 12, 2001 by Karen Rosenburg of Rolla, Mo. Two bowlers have fired 877 series — Jackie Mitskavich of Van Wert, Ohio, on Aug. 10, 1997 and Stephanie Hoover of Goshen, Ind., on March 9, 2007.

### Team USA Starts 'U15' Development Program Connected To Junior Gold

ARLINGTON, Texas — Youth bowlers age 15 and younger have a new reason to be United States Bowling Congress Junior Gold members with the creation of a U15 development program for Junior Team USA. The move comes in connection with a successful addition of a new U15 division as part of the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships.

"Young teens now have even more incentive to be part of Junior Gold," International Bowling Campus Director of Youth Development Chad Murphy said. "By making the trip to the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, the U15 kids not only have chance to win a national title, but can earn the dream of a lifetime — an opportunity to train as part of the Team USA program."

The U15 division of the Junior Gold Championships proved to be a popular addition in 2012 with 312 participants. Murphy expects that number to grow in 2013 with the additional incentive of a chance to compete in Tournament of the Americas and training at the ITRC.

"Young teens now have even more incentive to be part of Junior Gold," International Bowling Campus Director of Youth Development Chad Murphy said. "We look forward to developing North Pointe Junior Gold into the destination event of the year for bowlers 15 and under. Creating a premier national event for younger teens is a focus, and we expect great interest from this age group at the 2013 event in Detroit."

U.S. Players Gain Experience at Tournament of the Americas

The United States not only came away with 28 gold medals at the 50th Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas but with a wealth of experience that will help each player in the future.

The tournament concluded Saturday in Tamarac, Fla., with the United States claiming the team gold medal in four of the five divisions at Sawgrass Lanes. The U.S. took gold in the Junior A (ages 16-19), Junior B (ages 12-15), Senior and Super Senior divisions, while Team USA finished with the bronze in the Adult division.

In addition to winning four team gold medals, the United States also locked up six individual all-events gold medals and won the national all-events in four of the five divisions. The U.S. took bronze in the Adult national all-events.

Three U.S. players managed to complete the gold-medal sweep, winning the gold in every event in which they participated.

The Lee Evans Tournament of the Americas is the oldest annual international tournament in the American Zone.

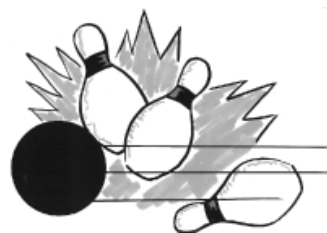

# Rules Are Foundation of the Bowling Game

• Rules are the foundation of the bowling game. The USBC and formerly the ABC and WIBC were founded to develop and enforce uniform rules for the game. Before the ABC and WIBC developed the rules and specifications, the physical aspects of our game could vary dependent upon the area of the country or bowling alley. Once the specifications were established, the game became more of a sport, with which competitors from across the country could com-

pete. By defining those rules and specifications, competitors could refine their "game" to compete with others on the same playing field.

The rules have changed throughout the 100+ years of the organized competition, but the physical characteristics have remained virtually unchanged. This is one of the items that makes our game great.

Rules have to be updated to keep up with some changes in society. Each year changes are proposed

to the USBC Convention delegates for their action.

Each year the changed rules in the book are marked with brackets ([]) to denote a change. The MDUSBC is dedicated to helping members, league officers and leagues understand the rules. Because of this the office staff answers many questions surrounding the rules, which is one of our support functions to the membership.

Many of the rules questions we get center around league fee arrearages, postponements, forfeits, position rounds, etc. Each

### OFFICER SCHOOLS

• Historically the Metro Detroit USBC and former organizations have set aside dates to distribute supplies to leagues for the upcoming seasons. This year there will be no set dates for distribution.

Due to the fact that half of the centers within MDUSBC host their own distribution school for their leagues only, the leagues which would attend the association-wide distribution has dwindled dramatically.

Each league secretary should check with their center to determine if the center will be hosting a center-only distribution night. In those cases all of the supplies will be given out at that center by MDUSBC representatives.

For those leagues where the center will not be hosting a center-only event, the supplies can be picked up at the MDUSBC office Monday, Tuesday, Thursday or Friday from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. If this is inconvenient please call the association office to make other arrangements.

situation has its own merits and many times determinations need to be made whether a particular rule fits the situation, which is where the MDUSBC can be helpful in that determination.

It is important for all members to be aware of the rules, so that they can comply and enjoy the game of bowling more. If you are bowling in an unsanctioned league, think about the rules support you receive as a member of the MDUSBC that you'd miss. The real problem in bowling in an uncertified league is that you never realize what you're missing until you need it and it's not there.

There are three new rule changes that may affect league operations in the 2012-2013 season.

USBC Rule 113b and USBC Rule 113c

under Procedures and Special Contests requires that games bowled in a playoff or special contest to count toward averages.

USBC Rule 118b under How Established allows the league board of directors to adjust a player's average upward during the season with a two-thirds vote.

USBC Rule 120 under Position Rounds will default to total pins plus handicap to be used to break ties for position matches for handicap leagues unless a league has a rule otherwise.

The Metro Detroit USBC Association is committed to making the game more enjoyable for everyone involved. One of the ways we do that is to participate in the rules making process at the convention and by helping the members understand the rules. The

# Lead-Off Should be 'Deadly' Spare-Shooter

• **IDLE BOWLING** thoughts:

A team's lineup positions can be very important. All-time great Parker Bohn III feels that your leadoff individual should be a deadly spare shooter, one that can mark when it counts most and one that can spark the spirit of a team. The anchor, or final bowler in the lineup should be your best all-around bowler, but not necessarily the one with the highest average. A top anchor can hit the pocket when the pressure is on, is a good solid spare bowler, but one better known for coming up with that strike or two when needed in a tight game.

There is no such thing as an easy spare, unless it's the one you don't have to face

because you got a strike.

Did you know that up until 1994, from 1958, pro bowlers had to follow strict limits on the length of hair, pony tails, braids and beards.

In the more than 50 years that pro bowling has been on TV, the happening causing the most comment was not a big win, not a particular match, not a perfect game, but Mark Roth's first ever TV conversation of the 7-10 split.

You hear about the 300 games rolled in bowling. But a real rarity in bowling is a 291 game, and the rarest of them all in the upper category is a 292 game.

Bowling does have some power to make

people much more attentive to dates. The same people who make medical and business matter appointments mere days in advance often enter bowling tournaments two years prior to the competition.

The move to Texas by most integers in bowling will take time, particularly such attractions as the International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum, but it has to be one of the most forward thinking bowling ideas in the history of the sport.

The more you study bowling history the more you realize that the negative of bowling has been expanded and repeated much more than the more prevalent positives of the sport — at every level.

Many long years ago John Petraglia was asked who he saw as the future stars. His selections were Parker Bohn III, Dave Ozio, Amleto Monacelli, Pete Weber, Brian Voss and Del Ballard. That's what you call a super crystal ball. All became top stars and all have been elected to the PBA Hall of Fame.

The good old days were when you were

pretty sure you could bowl your weight.

When you discuss smooth bowlers the name of the late Joe Joseph comes to mind most often. For a fairly big man, he moved to the line with all the grace and balance of dancing legend Fred Astaire. One big difference, Joseph carried a heavy bowling ball, not a light hat or cane.

The head pin of a bowling setup probably has more strange remarks directed to it than any other inanimate object in the world.

Any league secretary or tournament director will tell you that the people who know all the bowling rules and let you know they do are not nearly as bad as the bowlers who think they know all the rules.

# Accessory Kit a Must for Your Equipment Bag

TIPS FROM THE PROS

• THIS ISSUE I will cover learning to customize your ball surface for the lane conditions you bowl on. Every serious league bowler should have an accessory kit which includes scissors, bowler's tape, easy slide, a towel, sandpaper or "Scotch-Brite" pads of different grits and some kind of skin protector patch for calluses. Keeping an accessory kit with these items will prepare you for most situations.

In bowling, the biggest influence in determining whether your ball is going to hook or not is the surface of your bowling ball.

Learning to match your ball surface to the conditions is very important in controlling your hook or lack of hook.

When you buy bowling equipment, some balls have a shiny surface and some balls have a dull or semi-dull finish. Balls that have a shiny appearance have been polished or waxed and will skid longer. Wax or polish fills the pores in the shell of the ball and coats the ball surface reducing the lane friction, thus producing more skid. Whereas a dull ball finish is achieved by sanding the surface with sandpaper or "Scotch-Brite" pads. The dull surface is rougher and will produce more friction thus gripping the lane surface more and producing more hook.

If you bowl in a center that uses a heavy oil pattern, you should use a ball with more "surface." Most pro shops use different grits of sandpaper to achieve more or less hook. A sandpaper that is a 320 or 400 grit is used for oily lanes and a 500 to 600 grit is more for medium oiled lanes. When the lanes are very dry, your local pro shop can use very fine grits of sandpaper like 1000 and 1200 grit along with different polishes to shine your equipment or you can put your equipment in a "Lustre King" (if you can find one that works).

When you need to scuff your ball on your own, I suggest using "Scotch-Brite" sanding pads that you can get from your local hardware store and keep in your accessory bag. "Scotch-Brite" pads can be found in a

green pad (400 grit), burgundy pad (500 grit), grey pad (600 grit), and a white pad (1000 grit). During your warm-up before competition begins you can alter your surface by using the different pads.

When you sand or scuff up the ball surface, the WIBC and ABC rule requires you sand the entire surface of the ball. Sometimes just a little more "surface" can make a big difference in getting your ball to break at the right point. ABC and WIBC rules will not allow you to alter your surface once competition begins.

**Q: What exercises are good for bowling?**

**A:** If you are a serious bowler who competes in long format tournaments, I suggest



incorporating a fitness workout program with a personal trainer. I have personally belonged to a gym or health club for many years and currently work with personal trainer Dave Davis at "Tel-Ex Powerhouse Gym" in Southfield.

Bowlers should focus on building strong legs (leg curls, leg extensions, leg press, etc.). Most women

should do exercises to strengthen their wrists (wrist curls). Bowlers should try to do exercises that don't build a lot of bulk and inhibit mobility. Remember to always consult a physician before beginning an exercise program.

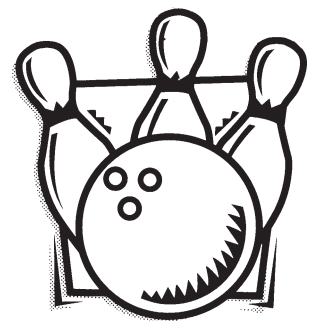
